
## Recommended Use:

Since applications vary, the appropriate dilutions must be determined for individual use.

## Data:

Mouse abdominal macrophages elicited by starch broth are stained with Anti-Mouse CD14 Monoclonal Antibody(APC Conjugated)(filled gray histogram). Unstained macrophages (blank black histogram) are used as control.
